NATIONAL FREQUENCY COORDINATORS COUNCIL, INC (NFCC) ENCOURAGES ATTENDANCE AT THE FREQUENCY COORDINATORS FORUM AT DAYTON HAMVENTION

Washington, D.C. – May 3, 2008 - The National Frequency Coordinators Council, Inc. (NFCC), a District of Columbia Corporation, today announced that the Dayton Hamvention recently published notice that another organization using the name of 'National Frequency Coordinators' Council' will hold a forum "on the current status of the organization and spectrum management" at the Dayton Hamvention on Friday, May 16, 2008 9:15 AM - 10:15 AM in Forum Room 5.

Although this forum is not authorized or endorsed by the National Frequency Coordinators Council, in the spirit of amateur cooperation, the NFCC encourages all interested amateurs to attend this meeting. The NFCC maintains the strong position that all amateurs – including frequency coordination officials and representatives - should work together for the betterment of the amateur radio service.

Steve Agee N5ZUA, President of the NFCC, Inc. said "A press release was recently sent out stating that the old National Frequency Coordinators' Council was dissolved in 2002 due to the revocation of its corporate status in the District of Columbia. This is indeed correct. Since then, the old NFCC continued in existence simply as an unincorporated association and only recently was re-incorporated in the state of Nebraska in response to the formation of the NFCC (District of Columbia Corporation).

Agee continued "Although it is not necessary for an organization to be incorporated in order to exist, incorporation does allow an organization to do some things that an unincorporated body cannot. The old NFCC continued to represent itself as a Corporation during the six year period after its corporation status was revoked, which is both unethical and illegal. The old NFCC continues to claim the ARRL (American Radio Relay League) recognizes the old NFCC by virtue of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the two organizations. The MOU clearly states the ARRL recognizes the NFCC, a District of Columbia Corporation. The old NFCC, which had its Corporate status revoked by the District of Columbia, and which was hastily reincorporated in Nebraska immediately following the District of Columbia's approval of the new NFCC, can no longer claim affiliation with the ARRL based on an invalid MOU."

The 2008 Dayton Hamvention is located at Hara Arena, 1001 Shiloh Springs Road in Trotwood, Ohio.
